#### BACKGROUND

The City of San Ramon, in concert with the Contra Costa Transportation Authority (CCTA), has embarked on the final phase of the Iron Horse Trail (IHT) Bicycle Pedestrian Overcrossing at Bollinger Canyon Road. The IHT is an 18-mile regional nonmotorized trail that runs north/south through the San Ramon Valley providing critical access to adjacent land uses. The construction of overcrossings at key locations will develop attractive travel alternatives for congestion relief for commute trips as well as enhancing facilities for schools, shopping, and recreational trips.

At Bollinger Canyon Road, the overcrossing will provide substantial benefits including:

- Improve safety by eliminating conflicts between pedestrians, bicyclists, and motorists;
- Improve motor vehicle circulation by removing the at-grade crossings;
- Reduce and eliminate unsafe crossing maneuvers by pedestrians and bicyclists;
- Enhance safety by providing an environment that encourages walking and bicycling along the Iron Horse Regional Trail; and
- Increase trail usage by improving the connectivity at the Bollinger Canyon Road.

The final design for the project is complete. The project is currently in final phases of cost negotiations that are being led by CCTA. Following completion of the negotiations, it is anticipated that the project will go to the final award, and construction will begin in late Fall or early Winter beginning with steel fabrication and other long-lead items.

In August 2021, the Tri-Valley Transportation Council (TVTC) unanimously approved the 2020 TVTC Nexus Fee Update Study. Subsequently, on April 18, 2022, the TVTC unanimously adopted the 2022 Strategic Expenditure Plan (SEP) Update and SEP Funding Plan. The SEP Funding Plan includes Project C.11A Iron Horse Trail Bicycle Pedestrian Overcrossing at Bollinger Canyon Road. The SEP authorizes an appropriation of \$2,287,629 from the Tri-Valley Transportation Development Fund (TVTDF).

The TVTC Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) has determined that there is sufficient funding to allocate the \$2,287,629 in TVTDF this fiscal year 2022-23. Given that San Ramon is a member of TVTC and signatory to the Joint Exercise of Powers Agreement, San Ramon is the Project Sponsor. In this capacity, the \$2,287,629 in funds will be transmitted to the City of San Ramon.

# <u>RECITALS</u>

- A. WHEREAS, SAN RAMON, as one of the members of the Tri-Valley Transportation Council ("TVTC"), is a signatory to the Joint Exercise of Powers Agreement pertaining to the Tri-Valley Transportation Development Fee ("TVTDF"); and
- B. WHEREAS, the Iron Horse Trail Bicycle Pedestrian Overcrossing at Bollinger Canyon Road Project ("Project") is identified on List C of the TVTC Strategic Expenditure Plan ("SEP") and is programmed for funding in the SEP Funding Plan; and
- C. WHEREAS, SAN RAMON is the Project sponsor and requested a TVTDF funding allocation; and

A. To allocate and transmit to SAN RAMON \$2,287,629 of TVTDF funds for the Project.

A. To utilize the TVTDF funds solely for the Project, in accordance with the SEP.

- B. To keep and maintain accurate documentation consistent with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP) related to the expenditure of the TVTDF funds allocated for the Project.
- C. To make any and all documentation related to the Project's use of TVTDF funds available to TVTC or its representatives upon request.
- D. To promptly notify TVTC of any unspent TVTDF funds after Project completion and promptly return said funds to TVTC.



## BACKGROUND

The Tri-Valley Transportation Council (TVTC) adopted the Tri-Valley Transportation Plan/Action Plan (TVTP/AP) for Routes of Regional Significance in 1995. The TVTP/AP was later updated in 2000, 2009, and 2014. The Plan outlines the mutual understanding and agreement on Tri-Valley transportation concerns and recommendations for improvements.

In 1998, through a Joint Exercise Powers Agreement (JEPA), the seven-member agencies that comprise the TVTC originally approved the Tri-Valley Transportation Development Fee (TVTDF) program. The TVTDF is intended to allocate fair share costs for the regional projects identified in the TVTP/AP.

In 1999, the TVTC adopted a Strategic Expenditure Plan (SEP) which identified priorities, project sponsors, and funding for TVTDF projects. The TVTC updated the SEP in 2004, 2011, 2017, and 2022. The SEP originally established a funding plan for eleven regional transportation projects (List A). The TVTC then expanded this list to add 11 new projects (List B).

In August 2021, the TVTC unanimously approved the 2020 TVTC Nexus Fee Update Study. Subsequently, on April 18, 2022, the TVTC unanimously adopted the 2022 Strategic Expenditure Plan (SEP) Update and SEP Funding Plan. The SEP Funding Plan

includes Project C.6 Sunol/I-680 Widening. The SEP authorizes an appropriation of \$2,650,000 from the Tri-Valley Transportation Development Fund (TVTDF).

## DISCUSSION

The TVTDF is intended to provide partial funding for the prioritized projects that are ready to compete for federal funding and/or provide additional funding during the design or construction phase.

The Sunol Blvd and I-680 Interchange will be modified to improve safety, operations, improve congestion and upgrade bicycle facilities. These improvements include:

- Add an additional southbound multiple purpose on ramp lane
- Add a southbound high occupancy vehicle on ramp lane
- Signalize the northbound and southbound on/off ramps
- Add a Class IV bike lane on Sunol Blvd between Arlington Dr and Castlewood Dr
- Transform the intersection of Arlington Dr/Sunol Blvd into a protected intersection

The City of Pleasanton is the project lead with Caltrans providing project oversight. The City is required to follow the Caltrans project development process. The City completed a Project Study Report-Project Development Study in 2020 and is nearing completion of the Project Analysis & Environmental Document phase. The Strategic Expenditure Plan recommends \$2,650,000 in TVTDF funds to the City of Pleasanton, which will be used toward project design.

The TVTC Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) has determined that there is sufficient funding to cover the \$2,650,000 allocations in the TVTDF this fiscal year 2022-23.

## RECOMMENDATION

1. TVTC TAC recommends TVTC Board approve Resolution No. 2022-15 to allocate \$2,650,000 of TVTDF funds to fund the Sunol/I-680 Widening (Project C.6)

#### A RESOLUTION OF THE TRI-VALLEY TRANSPORTATION COUNCIL TO ALLOCATE \$2,650,000 IN TRI-VALLEY TRANSPORTATION DEVELOPMENT FEE (TVTDF) FUNDS TO THE CITY OF PLEASANTON FOR STRATEGIC EXPENDITURE PLAN PROJECT C.6 THE SUNOL BLVD AND I-680 INTERCHANGE WIDENING FOR FY 2022-2023

**WHEREAS,** in 1995, the Tri-Valley Transportation Council (TVTC) adopted the "Tri-Valley Transportation Plan/Action Plan (TVTP/AP) for Routes of Regional Significance; and

**WHEREAS,** in 1998, the TVTC, and the City of Pleasanton entered into a Joint Exercise Powers of Agreement (JEPA) to provide authority to collect a Tri-Valley Transportation Development Fee (TVTDF) to collect impact fees for the traffic mitigation to be applied to TVTC priority projects; and

**WHEREAS,** on August 16, 2021, TVTC unanimously approved Resolution No. 2021-10 Adopting the Tri-Valley Transportation Council 2020 Nexus Fee Update Study; and

**WHEREAS**, on April 18, 2022, the TVTC unanimously approved Resolution No 2022-07 Adopting the Strategic Expenditure Plan (SEP) Update and SEP Funding Plan, which guides the expenditure of revenue collected from TVTDF; and

**WHEREAS**, the SEP identifies priorities, project sponsors, and funding for TVTDF projects; and

**WHEREAS,** the 2022 Update of the SEP programmed \$2,650,000 in fiscal year 22/23 to Sunol/I-680 Widening (Project C-6); and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Pleasanton is the project sponsor and has requested project funding allocation for The Sunol Blvd and I-680 Interchange Widening (Project C.6) and

**NOW THEREFORE,** the Tri-Valley Transportation Council resolves as follows:

- The Tri-Valley Transportation Council authorizes an appropriation and transmission from the Tri-Valley Transportation Development Fee Account to the City of Pleasanton for the Sunol Blvd and I-680 Interchange Widening project (Project C-6) of \$2,650,000 as programmed in the SEP and SEP Funding Plan for fiscal years 2022/23.
- The Tri-Valley Transportation Council approves the draft Funding Agreement between TVTC and the City of Pleasanton substantially in the form attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit A, subject to final review and minor modification by TVTC's General Counsel and authorizes the Chair to execute the Funding Agreement.

#### FUNDING AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE TRI-VALLEY TRANSPORTATION COUNCIL AND CITY OF PLEASANTON FOR THE ALLOCATION OF TVTDF FUNDS IN THE AMOUNT OF \$2,650,000 FOR THE SUNOL BLVD AND I-680 INTERCHANGE WIDENING PROJECT (Project C-6)

This AGREEMENT is made and entered into as of \_\_\_\_\_\_ by and between the Tri-Valley Transportation Council and the City of Pleasanton (PLEASANTON), collectively referred to herein as the "Parties."

# <u>RECITALS</u>

- F. WHEREAS, PLEASANTON, as one of the members of the Tri-Valley Transportation Council ("TVTC") is a signatory to the Joint Exercise of Powers Agreement pertaining to the Tri-Valley Transportation Development Fee ("TVTDF"); and
- G. WHEREAS, the Sunol/I-680 Widening Project ("Project") is identified on List C of the TVTC Strategic Expenditure Plan ("SEP") and is programmed for funding in the SEP Funding Plan for fiscal years 2022/23; and
- H. WHEREAS, PLEASANTON is the Project sponsor and requested a TVTDF funding allocation; and
- I. WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 2022-15, TVTC approved the allocation of \$2,650,000 of TVTDF funds to PLEASANTON for the Project; and
- J. WHEREAS, the Parties desire to enter into this Funding Agreement to outline the terms and obligations associated with the allocation of TVTDF funds;

# NOW, THEREFORE, THE PARTIES DO HEREBY AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

## SECTION I

## TVTC AGREES:

B. To allocate and transmit to PLEASANTON \$2,650,000 of TVTDF funds for the Project.

## PLEASANTON AGREES:

- E. To utilize the TVTDF funds solely for the Project, in accordance with the SEP.
- F. To keep and maintain accurate documentation consistent with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP) related to the expenditure of the TVTDF funds allocated to the Project.

- G. To make any and all documentation related to the Project's use of TVTDF funds available to TVTC or its representatives upon request.
- H. To promptly notify TVTC of any unspent TVTDF funds after Project completion and promptly return said funds to TVTC.
